We're so proud of their interest and the lovely discussion that followed!

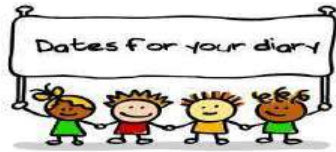


## 🍊 Tag Rugby Festival! 🍊
